PROJECT OVERVIEW

The South Sudan Resilient Livestock Sector Project is a five-year, Government-led national investment aimed at strengthening animal health systems, improving rangeland and water management, and enhancing the resilience of livestock-dependent communities. The project supports livelihoods, food security, and climate resilience in pastoralist and agro-pastoralist areas by promoting more productive, adaptive, and resource-efficient livestock systems.

Development Objective

To enhance animal health, improve rangeland management, and strengthen the resilience of livestock production in targeted project areas.

Geographic Coverage

Terekeka County in Central Equatoria State; **Mundri West and Mundri East County** in Western Equatoria State; **Tonj East and Tonj North County** in Warrap State; **Bor County and Twic East County** in Jonglei State; and **Fashoda County** in Upper Nile State.

Beneficiaries

Direct beneficiaries: 166,000 households

Women beneficiaries: At least 40 percent

Project Components

The Project has Three (3) Components and Six (6) Sub-components as follows:

Component 1:

Strengthening Animal Health and Welfare Systems (US\$16.5 million)

1.1: Capacity building for effective delivery of animal health services;

1.2: Implementation of livestock vaccination and deworming campaigns and construction.

Component 2:

Sustainable and Integrated Rangeland Development and Management for Livestock Production (US\$18,3 million)

2.1: Building capacity for sustainable rangeland management;

2.2: Support for natural resources-related infrastructure (water points and fodder conservation infrastructure) and critical capacity for livestock production;

Component 3:

Technical Assistance, Institutional Strengthening, and Project Management and Coordination (US\$5.2 million)

3.1: Capacity building support to MLF to strengthen coordination, national policy formulation, planning, and implementation capacity.

3.2: Project management, coordination, strategic and technical policy guidance and advisory services, supervision and oversight to project activities, including environmental and social safeguards, etc.

Expected Outcomes by 2030

- Reduction in prevalence and incidence of animal and zoonotic diseases as a result of expanded vaccination and veterinary services and veterinary infrastructure, etc.

- Increased Livestock production and productivity, the main sources of food & nutrition security and household income for pastoralists and agropastoralists

- Promotion of intercommunal cohabitation, conflict resolution and reduction over water and pasture

- Improved alignment of South Sudan's local regulations with regional protocols, through the strengthened national engagement in regional initiatives for prevent and control transboundary livestock diseases

- Reduced GHG emission intensity through distribution of Fuel-Efficient Stoves (FES) and planting of drought-resistant multi-purpose tree seedlings for restoration of ecosystems

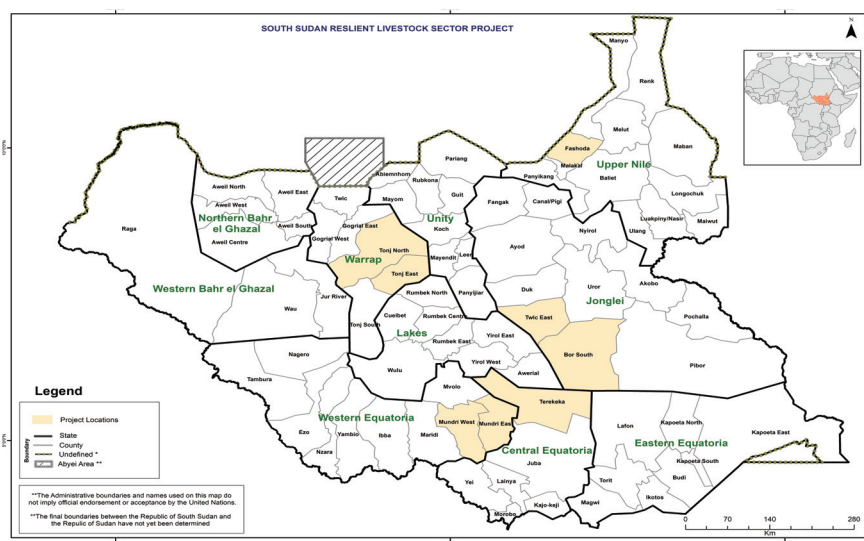
- Improved national, state and local level Governments capacity to plan, coordinate, regulate, and deliver livestock services

Livestock Population

- 38.4 Million Animals valued at **US\$ 2.2 billion**

- Over 70 percent of South Sudan population depend on livestock

- Over 5 million cattle, sheep, and goats are targeted through expanded vaccination, control of parasites, and veterinary services.
